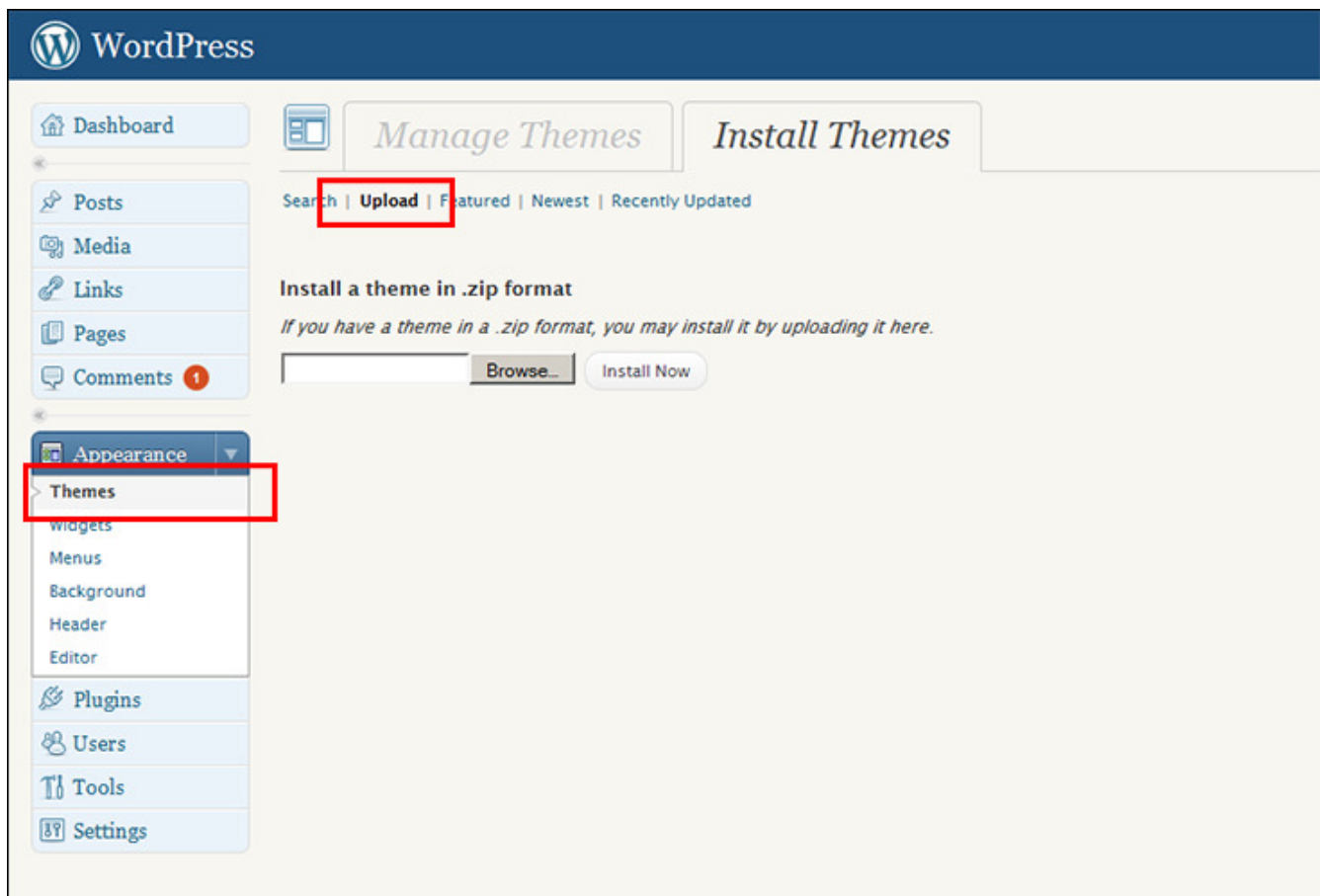

INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS

1. Go to your WordPress Backend.
2. Open **Appearance** → **Themes** → **Install Themes**
3. Navigate to **Upload**
4. Browse for **.zip** file on your local computer, and **Install** it.
5. Then go to back to **Appearance** → **Themes**, and **Activate** theme



Got an error during installation process?

- disable all your plug-ins and try installing the theme again,
- make sure you are running the latest recommended version of WordPress
- try uploading the theme manually via FTP, into the folder `/wp-content/themes/`

1. Go to **Appearance** → **Menus**
2. Create your own menus, using Categories, Pages and/or Custom Links
3. Specify your custom menus for **Theme Locations**

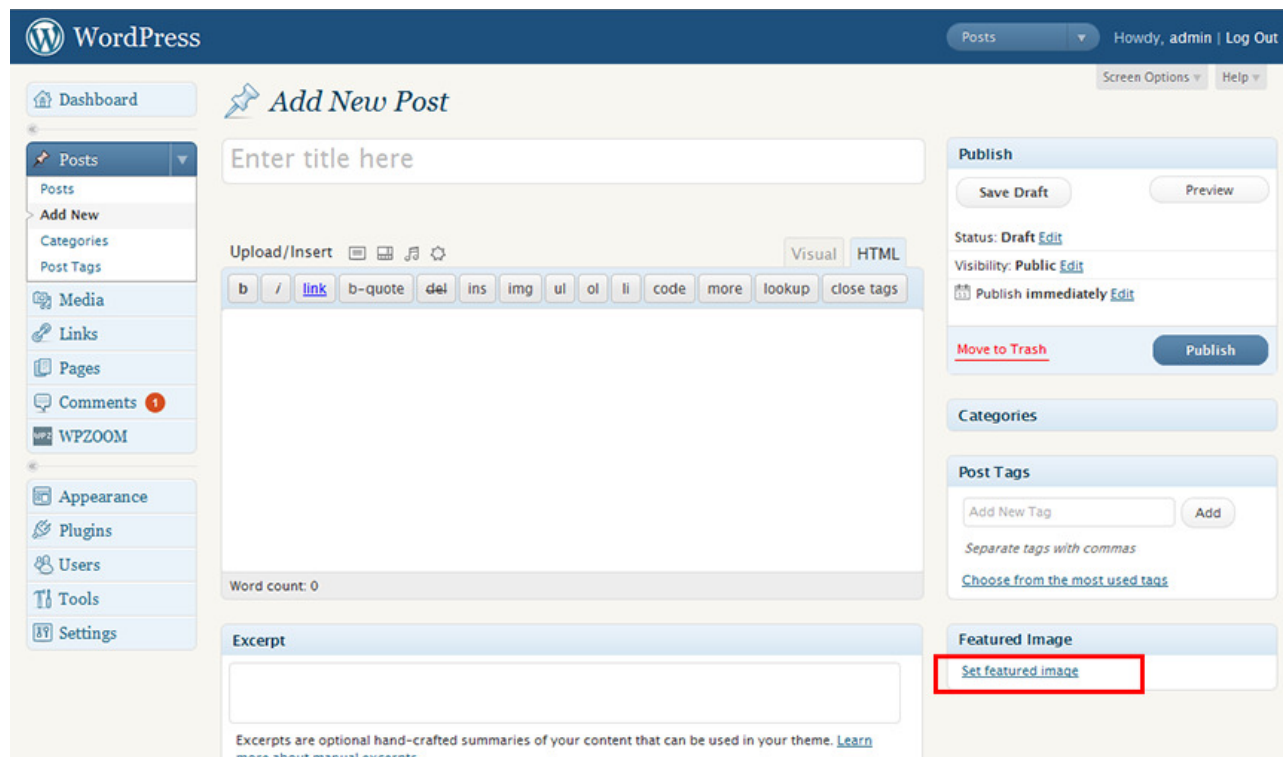
HOW THUMBNAILS SYSTEM WORK?

Since the release of WordPress 2.9 we have implemented the "Post Thumbnails" feature, which allows you to manually what image to use as a post's thumbnail.

When adding/editing a post, on the right side you will see a box: **Featured Image**.

Click on it, upload an image and then click the **"use as featured image"** button.

If you don't upload such a thumbnail, the theme will automatically try to use as a thumbnail the first image found in the post's content body.



If no image will be selected as Featured Image, then the theme will pull the first image from articles content to be used as thumbnail.

FILE PERMISSIONS

PHOTORIA Theme uses the **TimThumb** PHP script for dynamic image resizing in some parts of the theme.

If thumbnails don't appear on your web-site, follow these steps:

Set folder permissions **777** (rwx-rwx-rwx) to:

/wp-content/themes/photoria/scripts/

and

/wp-content/themes/photoria/scripts/cache/

Do not change the permissions of /scripts/timthumb.php, they should be left at default value. Otherwise TimThumb images resize script might not work properly.

Some important things to note:

1. **TimThumb** requires the **GD library**, which is available on any host server with PHP 4.3+ installed.
2. On some hosts **TimThumb** will work with **755** permissions (rwx-rx-rx). On other hosts, you need to set 777 only to the /scripts/cache/ folder, while keeping 755 permissions for the /scripts/ folder.
3. If you are hosting your site with **HostGator**, [take a look at this thread](http://code.google.com/p/timthumb/issues/detail?id=8) to solve the TimThumb issue:

4. TimThumb requires that you use images hosted on the same domain, so you cannot insert(hotlink) images from other sites. You have to upload them to your site first.

SUPPORT

Current version of **PHOTORIA Theme** has been developed for WordPress 3.0 and is not backwards compatible with older versions of WordPress.

PHOTORIA Theme has been tested in all modern browsers: IE 7, IE 8, Opera, Firefox, Safari and Google Chrome.
